Globalisation

Is it better to live in a global world?

In this unit, you will consider what it means to be a global citizen. You will consider how your everyday decisions can have an impact on the world and the people in it. You will also suggest ways of living more responsibly.

Introduction to politics

Who is in charge?

You have a role to play in improving our world through participation in politics. In this unit you will look at the role of our monarch and the government. You will compare the UK government with other examples from around the world and learn how laws are made.

Education

Should education be free for all?

Education is very important and you will consider the life changing impact of a good education. You will investigate Ruby Bridges and Malala Yousafzai and consider why they fought so hard for an education.

Trade & Aid

Do we have a responsibility to help others?

This unit considers the short-term and long-term benefits of both charity and fair-trading practices. You will consider the work of philanthropists and then justify whether we all have a responsibility to care for others.

Migration

Is Britain a welcoming country?

You will consider the history of migration to the UK and whether or not migrants have been welcomed. You will explain the difference between being a migrant and a refugee and use empathy to assess the treatment of people seeking asylum in the UK.

Synoptic unit: Health

Are we healthier than ever before?

Health is something which is often taken for granted. In this unit, you will consider health before the creation of the NHS and the significance of having a National Health Service. You will compare common causes of ill health in the 1800s with causes today.
