



RELIGIOUS STUDIES - YEAR 7

What does it mean to be Jewish?

This investigation enables pupils to learn in depth from some key concepts of Judaism. Students will explore the origins of the faith, beliefs and practices. Students will also look at the differences between different denominations and explore the faith in the 21st century.

What does it mean to be Christian?

This investigation enables pupils to learn in depth from some key concepts of Christianity. Students will explore the origins of the faith, beliefs and practices, then explore what difference believing in these would/could or should make to a person's life. Students will also look at the differences between different denominations and explore the faith in the 21st century.

What does it mean to be Muslim?

This investigation enables pupils to learn in depth from some key concepts of Islam and what it means to be a Muslim. Students will explore the origins of the faith, beliefs and practices, then explore what difference believing in these would/could or should make to a person's life. Students will investigate what differences and similarities the 3 Abraham faiths have.

What are the challenges of being religious today?

This investigation enables pupils to learn in depth from different religious believers and their way of living, beliefs and communities, providing opportunities to consider challenging questions about the place of religion in Britain today and in pupil's own thinking.

Should religious buildings be sold to feed the starving?

This investigation enables students to learn in depth about the purposes and types of worship. The key question makes students think about why places of worship exist and how they help religious communities. Students can answer whichever way they like, but balanced arguments and information are given in this unit as we explore the function of worship in the lives of religious communities.
