



ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year. The government states that every student's attendance should be at least 95%.






•How are we doing so far?

- October 12,741 vs 1061 = 92%




Year 10 so far...







































In summary...

- We encourage the creation and use of <u>flash cards</u>




